Subcommittee Updates

Governance and Nominating Committee

Board Member nominations

- A call for Board Member nominations (including self nominations) for the upcoming Sept 2024 Annual General Meeting. There are multiple positions to fill! Representatives from all provinces are welcome. We are urgently seeking health professionals dedicated to hemoglobinopathies from all disciplines. Board members must be CanHaem members. An election is held at the AGM to finalize next year's board members.
- The board position is a 3-year term with the ability to seek re-election.
 Commitment is minimal with a requirement to attend at least 50% of board meetings. These are held approximately every 2 months for one hour. Quorum is

- considered 6 board members at the meeting. Each board member is a voting member of the board.
- O Board members make decisions about the CanHaem budget (input on where to allocate funds), provide ideas for fundraising efforts, provide guidance as requested by committees (committees are self-governed but can request funding and guidance from the board), contribute to activities required by the organization that do not fall under the purview of a committee and other organizational management tasks.

- The governance and nominating committee is also seeking new members. The committee governs the organization, provides oversight, and ensures adherence to the bylaws. The GNC recruits potential board members (for election), reviews and approves membership applications for presentation at the AGM and suggests executive directors to the board based on governance guidance documents, bylaws, and board member terms.
 - Commitment: 2 meetings annually for less than one hour. Term: one year with the ability to renew.

Nursing Subcommittee

- The CanHaem Nursing Sub-committee has welcomed two new co-chairs. Erin Burrell is a Registered Nurse in the hemoglobinopathy lifespan clinic in Hamilton, ON and Lana Tacey is a Clinical Nurse Specialist with the Hematology/Oncology/Transplant program at Alberta Children's Hospital.
- They hold meetings virtually three times a year in addition to in person at the annual CanHaem Conference and have recently expanded to include allied health colleagues more formally on their invitations. The nursing sub-committee grown to include many new health care providers this year from across our provinces and we are delighted to see so many folks joining in hemoglobinopathy care.

Gene therapy is likely to be licensed in Canada in the relatively near future. Much work is still needed on the logistics of delivering this treatment in Canada. The CanHaem Gene Therapy subcommittee is diligently working on this topic and Dr. Kevin Kuo will be moderating a discussion about gene modifying therapies at the upcoming CanHaem conference in September.
